Unemployment:



Pension Not-so-fun Facts

- Unfunded liability \$129.092 billion
- Actuarial Accrued Liability for Active Members -\$64.488 billion (\$150 billion for retirees or inactives)
- 15% of TRS members are Tier II (SERS 29% & SURS 33%)
- Only 80 of 183 possible members in GARS are Tier I

- SB 3238 / HB 4415 Sales tax exemption for coal mining equipment

Bills that Haven't Passed Committee

- SB 2901 Unclaimed property
- HB 4680 Municipal gas use tax
- HB 4798 PPRT rate increase
- HB 3393/SB 3189/SB 1719 20% tax on investment services
- SB 2668 Sales of food at school are exempt
- SB 2703 Administrative hearing consolidation



Regulation Update

- In 2017, 9 DOR Rule-making projects went final
 - Most were non-controversial/procedural/updates
 - Two highlighted the nuttiness of our apportionment statute:
 - 100.3370—apportionment of service income
 - 100.3380/3390—more apportionment
- 2018 starting out even busier:
 - 5 DOR rules adopted already, plus DCEO new EDGE rules
 - 8 projects are pending in "first notice"; 1 in limbo after JCAR objected
 - 12 more drafts have been informally circulated
 - Most are non-controversial, primarily reflecting lawchanges

Regulations to Watch

- Oldies but goodies:
 - Definition of transportation company (draft from 2015; 100.9715)
 - Partnership replacement tax deduction for reasonable compensation (1st Notice 12/26/17; 100.2850)
 - Non-combination rule repeal (draft from 10/3/17; 100.3380)

More recent:

- New Unclaimed Property Rules (draft only)
- Conditional sale sourcing (1st Notice 3/16; 220.115 and others)
- Sales tax 30+ rule "clean-up" (1st Notice 3/23)
- Fracking tax (April draft; 475.100 et seq)
- UPIA (March draft; 700.100 et seq)



What's Going to Happen?

Key Dates:

- May 6: constitutional amendment deadline for passage in House and Senate (3/5 majority required to go on ballot; Governor irrelevant)
- May 31: Simple majority deadline for FY 2019 budget vote (after that, need 3/5 majority)
- July 1: FY 2019 begins
- November 6: General Election
- November/December/January: Veto and Lame Duck Sessions
- ALWAYS BET ON NOTHING



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
